

Our final topic this year will see us explore the most watched sporting event on the planet:

THE WORLD CUP



English

As a reader we will read 'Kane and the Mystery of the Missing World Cup' by Adrian Lobley. In this story children will travel back in time to investigate who actually won the World Cup in 1966.

As a writer we will write letters to Gareth Southgate and the England team wishing the players the best of luck for the upcoming tournament. We will follow their progress closely and write match reports and newspaper articles following their matches. We will also write our own half time team talk to motivate our team to glory!

As a speaker we will perform our team talks to the class with confidence and expression.

We also have our own reading and writing targets, which we will get regular opportunities to practise.

Maths

As a mathematician we will:-

- Measure accurately in cm and mm
- Convert between different units of measure
- Read and convert the time between analogue and digital
- Read a 24 hour clock to the nearest 5 minutes
- Calculate the perimeter and area of 2D shapes
- Identify acute, obtuse and right angles
- Interpret and present data in a range of ways

We also have our own targets to practise using our number cards. These targets will be regularly reviewed and changed when the target has been met.

Topic

As historians we will look back in time at previous winners of the trophy and plot these onto a timeline. We will have a special focus on the 1966 final and how football has evolved since this time.

As a geographer we will identify and locate the countries that have qualified for this summer's World Cup. We will also research the capital city of Moscow, where the final will be held, and discover its key features.

As artists we will design our own World Cup trophy and present our models to the class. We will also show facial expression and body language in our paintings of the fans.

RE

As religious learners we will explore Judaism. We will discover the origins of this faith through the lives and teachings of Moses and Abraham. We will also learn about the festivals, customs and traditions celebrated by Jewish families and identify similarities or differences to our own lives.

Languages

As a French speaker we will be working on our transfer project based on 'La Chasse a l'ours' - We're Going on a Bear Hunt.

Homework

Homework will be given out every Thursday and handed in the following Monday.

The children will take home their reading book every day and are encouraged to read regularly at home. We would ask you to comment in their reading diaries when they have read to you, this will earn them a dojo point!

They will have weekly spellings to learn which will be checked on Fridays in school.

Children will also bring home their Maths Target Tubs to practise their number work. Please feel free to comment in their target book.

Science

As a scientist we will continue learning about forces, friction and magnetic attraction. We will set up a fair test to investigate friction over different surfaces and record our results carefully and accurately. We will also explore the behaviour of magnets and predict whether objects will repel or attract each other.

PE

As a sportsperson this half term we will develop our ability to control a ball through Football. We will work on individual skills and discuss tactics and ways to keep possession of a ball through small matches. Children will need their outdoor PE kit in school every day which includes a pair of trainers - **no boots or pumps**. We will also continue our swimming lessons on a **Thursday** afternoon at Uttoxeter Leisure Centre.

This year's sports week will be themed around American sports and our Sports Day is on Friday 13th July.
