Arrangements for the Performance

Afternoon Performance

Weather related School Closure Procedures

Wherever possible, we open our school at times when weather warnings are issued. We are very conscious of the impact that school closure can have on families and children if we make the decision to close the school.

At a point when weather warnings are issued, the school follows a number of procedures to ensure that it is appropriate to open.

Factors considered include:

- Access routes to the school for both staff, parents and children (we appreciate many families travel by car, and many staff have to drive considerable distances to school)
- The weather forecast and conditions at the time
- The safety of the school site

We provide parents with as much notice as possible. We send a text message and an email message informing Parents if the decision has been made to close the school. If Parents do not receive a text or email informing them of a school closure, then they should assume that the school is open as usual.

If a decision is made for the school to open following initial checks, this decision will be reviewed throughout the day as factors may change. If at any point we are forced to close during the school day, we will make every effort to ensure parents are notified quickly and parents, children and staff can leave the school and return home safely.

These judgments are always difficult and we appreciate your patience and support at these times.
